

- **Bio:**
Paul Krabbe studied psychology at the University of Utrecht. He completed his PhD dissertation in 1998 at Erasmus University Rotterdam (Dept. of Public Health). At the moment he is positioned at the Department Epidemiology of the University Medical Center Groningen. He is an expert in (subjective) health-outcome measurement methodology, in particular 'health-related quality of life'. He has advised and planned many clinical studies and built up substantial experience with evaluation research in the field of health care.
- In 2004, as a visiting research fellow at the Harvard Initiative for Global Health (chaired by Christopher Murray), he investigated the application of scaling models as an alternative to the standard valuation techniques used to quantify health states.
- Apart from his methodological research related to health-state quantification, he has coordinated and advised on several medical studies and contributed to the development of the Dutch pharmacoeconomic guidelines to be used in decision-making on reimbursement. As member of the international EuroQol Group, he takes part in scientific research and development on measurement issues. Recently, he coordinated a large experimental study on discrete choice models.
